About Community Memorial Healthcare

Community Memorial Healthcare is a nonprofit, independent health system serving the health needs of Ventura County residents. Our organization was established in 2005 when Community Memorial Hospital in Ventura merged with Ojai Valley Community Hospital, and it is comprised of these two hospitals along with primary and specialty care Health Centers across our service area.

Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura

Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura has been caring for Ventura County since 1902. The hospital has 250 private rooms, an Emergency Department with 37 private rooms, 10 operating suites, 5 catheterization laboratories, and a state-of-the-art, 23-bed Level 3 Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU). Staffed with an array of experts in almost every medical specialty, our award-winning hospital is licensed by the California Department of Health Services and accredited by DNV Healthcare as an acute care hospital.

Awards and Recognition

Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura received the following awards and recognitions.

Outstanding Patient Experience and Five-Star Awards, Healthgrades

Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura has earned the 2025 Outstanding Patient Experience Award from Healthgrades for the second consecutive year, placing it among the top 15 percent of hospitals nationwide for patient experience. Pulmonary Rehabilitation Designated Facility (2024 – 2027)

This certification signifies that our facilities and pulmonary rehab program adhere to American Association of Cardiovascular and Pulmonary Rehabilitation standards and guidelines.

Primary Stroke Center (2024 – 2027), Det Norske Veritas, Inc. (DNV)

Designation as a Primary Stroke Center (PSC) indicates the hospital has the necessary staffing, infrastructure and programs to stabilize and treat most emergent stroke patients. We provide treatment for a broad range of stroke conditions, administer some acute therapies, and admit patients to a designated stroke unit or to beds, specifically assigned for stroke care.

Get with the Guidelines (GWTG) – Stroke GOLD PLUS with Target: Type 2 Diabetes Honor Roll, American Heart Association/American Stroke Association/American Diabetes Association
GWTG awards recognize hospitals that demonstrate at least 85% compliance in each of the seven Get With The Guidelines® – Stroke Achievement Measures. The measures relate to speed and quality of treatment. This designation recognizes that Community Memorial patients with type 2 diabetes receive the most up-to-date, evidence-based care when hospitalized with cardiovascular disease or stroke.

The California Department of Public Health Antimicrobial Stewardship Program Honor Roll recognizes the top performing antimicrobial stewardship programs in California. Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura, is located at 147 North Brent Street, Ventura, CA 93003, in Ventura County. The hospital shares a service area with Community Memorial Hospital – Ojai. The service area includes 17 ZIP Codes in 10 cities or communities in Ventura County including: Camarillo, Fillmore, Oak View, Ojai, Oxnard, Point Magu, Port Hueneme, Santa Paula, Somis and Ventura.

Community Health Needs Assessment

As part of the Ventura County Community Health Improvement Collaborative (VCCHIC), Community Memorial Healthcare completed a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) in 2025 as required by state and federal law. VCCHIC is a formal, charter-bound partnership of seven health agencies that participated in the development of a joint CHNA report. The agencies that constitute VCCHIC include:

The CHNA is a primary tool used by Community Memorial Healthcare to determine its community benefit plan, which outlines how it will give back to the community in the form of healthcare and other community services to address unmet community health needs. The assessment incorporated components of primary data collection and secondary data analysis that focused on the health and social needs of the service area.

Secondary data were collected from local, county, and state sources to present community demographics, social determinants of health, life expectancy, mortality, and disparities. Where available, these data are presented in the context of Ventura County and California, framing the scope of an issue as it relates to the broader community. In addition, the CHNA included community surveys, focus groups and partner listening sessions with community stakeholders to obtain input on health needs, barriers to care and resources available to address the identified health needs. The collected data were used to identify significant community health needs.

Significant Health Needs

The significant health needs identified in the 2025 CHNA are listed below in alphabetical order. These identified significant health needs were analyzed and then prioritized with community input through interviews with representatives from community-based organizations and surveys with community residents.

Once the CHNA was completed, the Community Memorial Healthcare Community Health Committee met on July 9, 2025 to discuss the significant health needs. The following criteria were used by the committee to determine the significant health needs the hospital will address in the Implementation Strategy:

Existing Infrastructure: There are programs, systems, staff and support resources in place to address the issue.

Established Relationships: There are established relationships with community partners to address the issue.

Ongoing Investment: Existing resources are committed to the issue. Staff time and financial resources for this issue are counted as part of the community benefit effort.

Focus Area: The hospital has acknowledged competencies and expertise to address the issue, and the issue fits with the organizational mission.

The CHNA served as the resource document for the review of significant health needs as it provided data on the scope and severity of issues and included community input on the health needs. The prioritization of significant health needs by the VCCHIC Steering Committee members and community focus group and listening session organization representatives was also taken into consideration. As a result of the review of needs and application of the above criteria, Community Memorial Hospital - Ventura will address the following priority health needs:

- Access to healthcare
- Chronic diseases and healthy lifestyles
- Mental health
- Substance use

Addressing Priority Health Needs

In 2025, Community Memorial engaged in activities and programs that addressed the priority health needs identified in the 2026 – 2028 Implementation Strategy. Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura addressed access to healthcare, chronic diseases and healthy lifestyles, mental health and substance use. Activities and programs that highlight the hospital's commitment to the community are detailed below.

Access to Healthcare

Caregiver Navigator Program

Navigators addressed caregiver needs by connecting clients to home health, respite care, mental health, and other community resources. They assisted with communication and coordination with healthcare providers and created opportunities for caregiver education. Through this program, 250 people were assisted.

Community Support

Community Memorial participated in community collaborative groups that addressed access to healthcare and social needs in the community. In addition, the hospital supported community organizations through cash and in-kind contributions.

Financial Aid

Following our Financial Assistance Policy, the hospital provided discounted and free health care to qualified individuals.

Homeless Support

People experiencing homelessness were provided with food, clothing, transportation and temporary housing support upon discharge.

Homeless Clinic

On-site visits were provided to people housed at a Recuperative Care facility in Ventura. This is temporary housing for individuals experiencing homelessness. This recuperative care center is the only facility serving Ventura County. Community Memorial holds 2 beds for patients being discharged from the hospital without a home.

Staff members and Medical Residents visited the facility regularly to conduct well visits to prevent readmissions. They attend to anyone who needs or wants to be seen, not limited to Community Memorial patients.

Maternal Child Health

The hospital provided education classes and support that reached over 850 women and families. Birth at Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura is not required to participate in these community programs.

- Breastfeeding Support Group

Street Medicine

The Street Medicine program offered consistent aid to individuals experiencing homelessness residing in the river bottom. Every Tuesday morning, a committed group assembled with nutrition, clothing, medical supplies, and other essential services. The effort was a collaboration among several organizations, including Community Memorial Healthcare:

- Conejo Health
- Downtown Ventura Partners' Park Ambassador Program
- Project Understanding
- Ventura County Public Health
- Ventura County Public Health HIV/AIDS Center
- Community Volunteers, Family and Friends

The Street Medicine team conducted 31 weekly clinics, providing 1,085 patient encounters, connecting individuals to case management, outpatient treatment, medication-assisted treatment support, and additional community resources.

Through this collaborative partnership, Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura supported patient-centered approaches that promote safety, dignity, education, and long-term recovery for some of the county's most vulnerable populations.

Transportation Services

Transportation was made available to patients and families having difficulty accessing care. Additionally, taxi vouchers and Uber Health were utilized to transport Recuperative Care patients to and from medical appointments.

Chronic Diseases and Healthy Lifestyles

Cancer Resource Center

The Cancer Resource Center offered services, support, and educational opportunities for cancer patients, their families and caregivers, and the community at large. Services were offered at no cost, in a welcoming, non-hospital environment. The Cancer Resource Center provided an Oncology Nurse Navigator, nutrition consultations, social services support, wig and hat bank, classes, and support groups. Classes and support groups were available virtually and in-person and provided more than 1,220 people with 9,400 encounters and included:

- Breast Cancer Support Group
- Calm Art (art therapy class)
- Cancer Nutrition Class
- General Cancer Support Group
- Gynecological Cancer Support Group
- Head and Neck Support Group
- Lymphedema therapy
- Nutritional counseling (one-on-one counseling with Dietitian)

- Ostomy Support Group
- Cancer Survivorship Class Series
- Reiki
- Yoga (virtual and in-person)

Community CPR

Community CPR and first aid classes provided more than 300 community residents with life-saving education and training. First aid support was provided by staff RNs at the Relay for Life and the St. Patrick's Day Parade.

Community Support

Community Memorial participated in community collaborative groups that addressed chronic diseases and healthy lifestyles. In addition, the hospital supported community organizations through cash and in-kind contributions.

Health Education and Outreach

Health education sessions were offered free of charge and covered a wide range of topics related to preventive care, healthy lifestyles, disease prevention and management. More than 400 people participated in the following education sessions:

- Advance Care Planning Workshop
- Protecting Our Kids, Families & Community FACT & FICTION ABOUT VACCINES (virtual and in-person, English & Spanish)
- Stroke Prevention Education

Health and wellness information and resources were shared with over 5,000 people at the Pacifica High School Student Wellness event, Santa Paula Senior Expo, Ventura Marathon, Ventura County Public Defender's Office Resource Fair, The Port of Hueneme Banana Festival, and other Ventura County community events.

The hospital provided an online subscription available to the community to access health information on prevention and treatment topics.

LiveStrong

The LiveStrong program was developed to promote the importance of physical activity after a cancer diagnosis. The 12-week physical activity program was designed by LiveStrong Foundation and is hosted by YMCA of the USA. Community Memorial Healthcare funded the LiveStrong program at the local Ventura YMCA. There were 30 graduates in 2025.

Support Groups

The following support groups were offered to community members and their caregivers. More than 1,080 encounters were provided:

- Breast Cancer support group
- Breastfeeding support group
- Caregiver support group
- General Cancer support group
- Gynecological Cancer support group

- Head and Neck support group

Wellness & Fitness Center

The Community Memorial Wellness & Fitness Center is a spacious and secure facility that offers community members gym services at reduced rates, free health education and screening sessions, and exercise classes. Additionally, the Wellness & Fitness Center coordinates community education, preventive care clinics, screenings and vaccinations.

- A weekly community outdoor yoga class served 50 people
- A weekly community outdoor tai chi class reached 141 people
- A free weekly adaptive yoga class reached 91 people
- A free ostomy clinic assisted 55 people with ostomy care
- Community flu vaccination clinics reached 278 people
- Stroke education was provided to 120 people in partnership with the YMCA
- Blood pressure screenings were provided to 56 people
- Low-cost mobile mammography was provided to 35 women

Wise & Well

A free online program that provided social media messages, an e-newsletter and podcasts with health information, healthy recipes and community resources. The podcast and newsletter reached 43,903 community residents in 2025.

Mental Health and Substance Use

Community Support

Community Memorial participated in community collaborative groups that addressed mental health and substance use across the life span. In addition, the hospital supported community organizations through cash and in-kind contributions.

Health Education and Outreach

Health education sessions were offered free of charge and covered a wide range of topics related to mental health and substance use.

Justice Involved Program

Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura worked with the Ventura County Sheriff's office and provided addiction services to those who needed Medicated Assisted Treatment (MAT). The program provided Substance Use Disorder Screening Intakes for any justice involved patient on MAT by a Community Memorial Patient Navigator (Licensed Clinical Social Worker). Referrals were given to Community Memorial pre-release and screenings were provided in custody. Upon release, individuals met in person with a Community Memorial Addiction Medicine Medical Staff member for MAT services. Appointments were scheduled within three days of release from County Corrections, and group and individual appointments were provided. The program provided wrap-around care and follow up visits and provided ongoing support for MAT treatment and social work services beyond 90 days, if needed. To date,

Community Memorial has provided more than 291 intakes in jail and enrolled 200 individuals in the program.

Outpatient Addiction Medicine

Community Memorial provided outpatient services for substance use treatment. Addiction medicine specialists have advanced training in the genetic, biological, psychosocial, and spiritual aspects of addiction. Services included cognitive behavioral therapy, pharmacotherapy, counseling, and group therapy.

Outpatient Mental Health

Outpatient behavioral and mental health services included the evaluation, diagnosis, and management of

- Anxiety
- Attention-deficit and hyperactivity disorder (ADHD)
- Bipolar illness
- Depression
- Mood and thought disorders
- Substance use disorder
- Trauma
- Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD)
- Dual-diagnosis

Substance Use Navigation

Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura offered a program to help patients with a Substance Use Disorder (SUD) get treatment for their addiction. A substance use navigator helped people with SUD by initiating treatment in the hospital, connecting patients to follow-up care, and advocating for culture change to reduce stigma and discrimination.

Other Community Benefit Services

Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura provided community benefit services in addition to those programs that focused on addressing priority health needs.

Health Professional Education

Definition: Education programs for physicians, nurses, and other health professionals.

Graduate Medical Education

Community Memorial Healthcare began residency training in 2013 with accredited programs in Internal Medicine, Family Medicine, and Orthopedic Surgery. Since then, we have expanded our academic medicine program to include General Surgery and Psychiatry. The goal of our Graduate Medical Education program is to train outstanding physicians who work in a collaborative environment and give back to the communities with which they are involved. All five of our residency programs are ACGME accredited. We also offer an integrated Behavioral Health Psychology fellowship.

The JW Moore Lecture Series provided continuing medical education, which was made available to health professionals in the community. Physicians and content experts provided education on a variety of topics. In 2025, 103 health professionals participated in the JW Moore Lecture Series.

Nursing

Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura precepted 247 nursing students from California State University Channel Islands, West Coast University and Ventura Community College.

Research

Definition: Research is the study or investigation to generate generalizable knowledge made available to the public. Research includes the communication of findings and observations, including publication in a journal. Internally funded research and research funded by tax-

exempt, or government entities are eligible for reporting.

Community Memorial Healthcare has a Research Department that supports research studies.

Subsidized Health Services

Definition: Clinical services provided despite a financial loss to the organization. The financial loss is measured after removing losses associated with bad debt, financial assistance, Medicaid, and other means-tested government programs.

Outpatient Clinics

Community Memorial Healthcare provided subsidized outpatient services and primary care centers in the community service area.

Cash and In-Kind Donations

Definition: Funds and in-kind services donated to community groups and nonprofit organizations.

Cash Donations and In-Kind Support

Funds and staff time were donated to nonprofit community groups and local organizations. The support of these organizations furthered the health system's mission, addressed the community health needs identified through the CHNA, and focused on community health, wellness, and safety.

Medications were donated as a part of a Medical Mission Trip. Medical missions served patients in countries most in need of medical treatment who could not afford health care services or who did not have access to health care in their villages.

Community Benefit Plan 2026

Significant Needs the Hospital Intends to Address

Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura participated in the Ventura County Community Health Improvement Collaborative (VCCHIC) to develop a county-wide Community Health Implementation Strategy. The hospital intends to take actions to address the following health needs identified in the 2025 CHNA and detailed in the 2026 – 2028 Implementation Strategy:

- Access to Healthcare
- Chronic Diseases and Healthy Lifestyles
- Mental Health
- Substance Use

Access to Healthcare

Goal

- Increase access to services and resources to improve the health and welfare of community residents.

Strategies

Caregiver Navigator Program – Navigators address caregiver needs by connecting clients to home health, respite care, mental health, and other community resources. They assist with communication and coordination with healthcare providers and created opportunities for caregiver education.

Community Support – Provide donations and in-kind support to nonprofit community organizations dedicated to addressing access to healthcare and providing support services.

Financial Assistance for the Uninsured or Underinsured – Provide financial assistance through free and discounted care and government health programs for low-income patients for health care services, consistent with the hospital's financial assistance policy.

Homeless Clinic – Provide on-site visits to people housed at a Recuperative Care Center for individuals experiencing homelessness. This Center is the only facility serving Ventura County. Staff members and Medical Residents go to the facility regularly to conduct visits.

Insurance Enrollment – Assist people who are uninsured or underinsured to enroll in publicly available health insurance programs.

Maternal Child Health – Provide education classes and support for women and families. Birth at Community Memorial Hospital is not a requirement to participate in these programs.

Street Medicine – Offer aid to individuals experiencing homelessness residing near the river bottom. The Community Memorial team will provide services such as vaccines, wound care assistance, triage/physical exams, addiction medicine, care coordination, referrals/assessments for treatment, ECM referrals, insurance enrollment and health navigation.

Transportation and Support Services – Provide transportation for people who cannot afford transportation to or from medical services and appointments. For people living in poverty, provide medications, assisted living, and care management services.

Chronic Disease and Healthy Lifestyles

Goals

- Reduce the impact of chronic diseases on health and increase the focus on chronic disease prevention and treatment.
- Reduce overweight and obesity by increasing healthy eating and physical activity.

Strategies

Cancer Resource Center – Offer services, support, and educational opportunities for cancer patients, their families and caregivers, and the community at large. The Cancer Resource Center provides an Oncology Nurse Navigator, nutrition consultations, social services support, wig and hat bank, classes, and support groups, at no cost.

Community CPR – Provide community CPR and first aid classes.

Community Support – Provide donations and in-kind support to nonprofit community organizations dedicated to addressing chronic diseases and healthy lifestyles strategies.

Health Education and Outreach – Conduct community health sessions and attend community events to provide information on chronic disease prevention, management, and treatment, preventive care and healthy lifestyles.

LiveStrong – Promote the importance of physical activity after a cancer diagnosis. This 12-week physical activity program was designed by LiveStrong Foundation and is hosted by YMCA of the USA.

Support Groups – Offer support groups to community caregivers and their families at no cost.

Wellness & Fitness Center – Offer community members gym services at reduced rates, free health education and screening sessions, and exercise classes. Additionally, the Wellness & Fitness Center coordinates community education, preventive care clinics, screenings, and vaccinations.

Wise & Well – Offer a free online program that provides social media messages, an e-newsletter and podcasts with health information, healthy recipes, and community resources.

Mental Health and Substance Use

Goals

- Increase access to mental health and substance use services in the community.
- Improve screening and identification of mental health and substance use needs.

Strategies

Community Support – Provide donations and in-kind support to nonprofit community organizations that address mental health and substance use services.

Health Education and Outreach – Provide mental health and substance use and misuse education classes to increase community knowledge and increase awareness of prevention and treatment services available in the community.

Justice Involved Program – Provide Substance Use Disorder Screening Intakes for any justice involved patient who needs Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT).

Outpatient Addiction Medicine – Provide outpatient services for substance use treatment.

Outpatient Mental Health – Provide outpatient services for behavioral and mental health services, including evaluation, diagnosis and management of mental health disorders.

Substance Use Navigation – Offer a program to help people with a Substance Use Disorder (SUD) get treatment for their addiction. A substance use navigator assists people with SUD by initiating treatment in the hospital, connecting patients to follow-up care, and advocating for culture change to reduce stigma and discrimination.

Planned Collaboration: as a VCCHIC member organization, Community Memorial Healthcare will commit staff time and resources to support these activities. In addition, collaborative partners include:

Evaluation of Impact

Through the CHNA process, community stakeholders provided input on the community health needs impacting the community, prioritization of the needs, and resources to address the needs. Appendix 2 identifies the community groups that were consulted.

Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura is committed to monitoring and evaluating key initiatives to access the programs and activities outlined in our Implementation Strategy. We have implemented a system for the collection and documentation of tracking measures, such as the number of people reached or served, and collaborative efforts to address health needs. An evaluation of the impact of the actions to address these significant health needs will be reported in the next scheduled CHNA.

Priority Health Needs That Will Not Be Addressed

Since the hospital cannot directly address all the health needs present in the community, Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura will concentrate on those health needs that we can most effectively address given our areas of focus and expertise. The hospital has insufficient resources to effectively address all the identified needs and, in some cases, the needs are being addressed by others in the community. Taking existing hospital and community resources into consideration, Community Memorial Hospital – Ventura will not directly address the remaining health needs identified in the CHNA, including economy, education, environmental health, prevention and safety, and sociopolitical environment.
